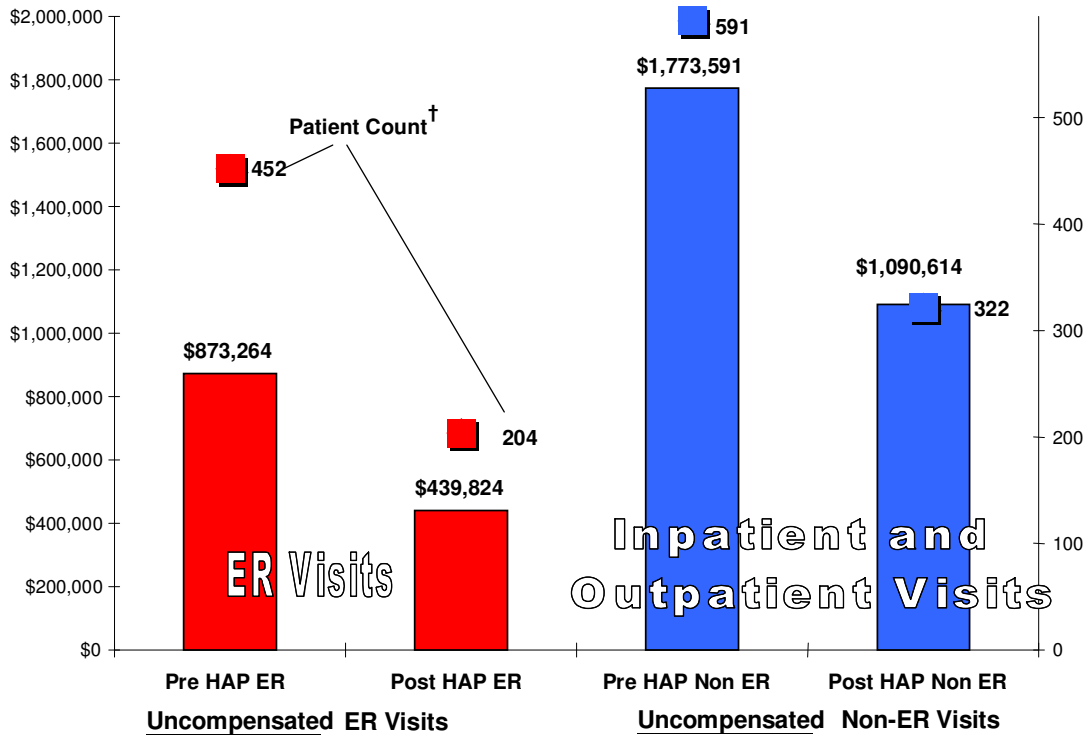
Hospital Use Before and After HAP Enrollment

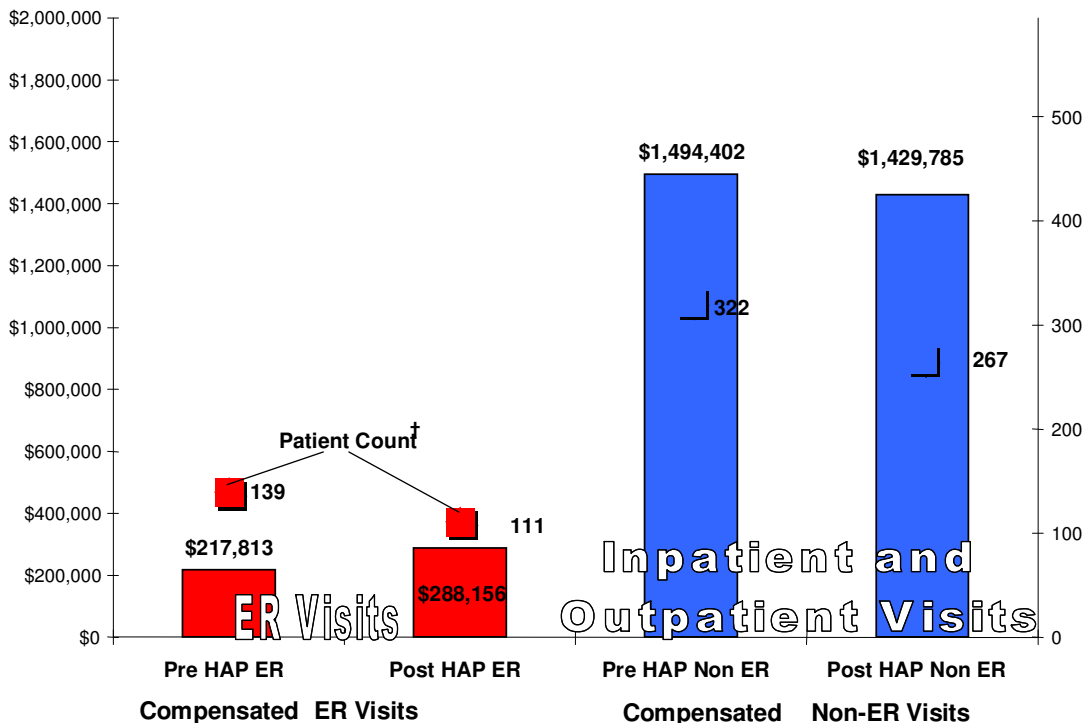
248 fewer Uncompensated ER patients

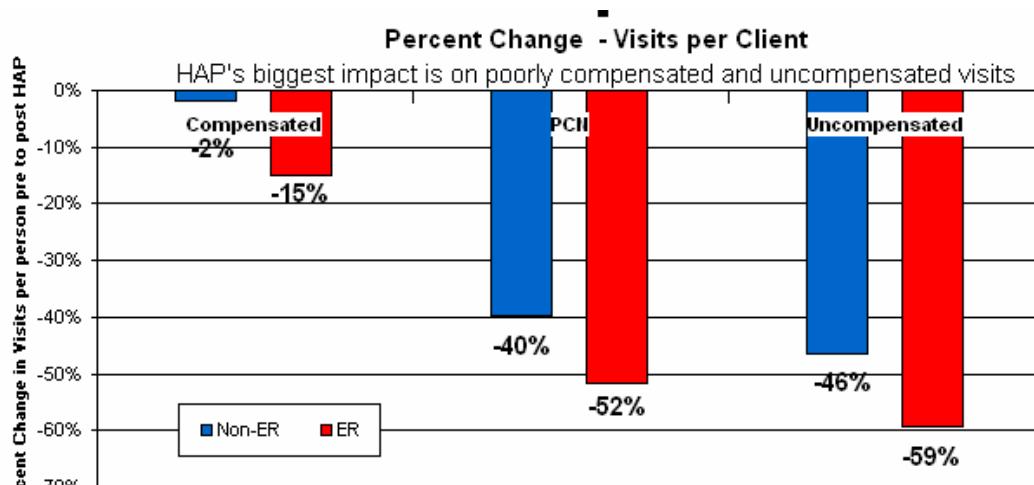
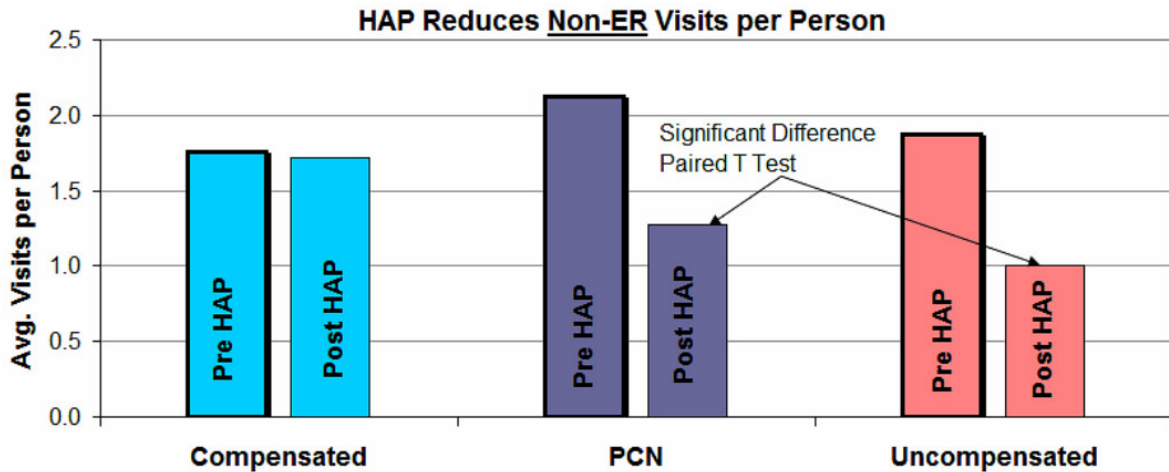
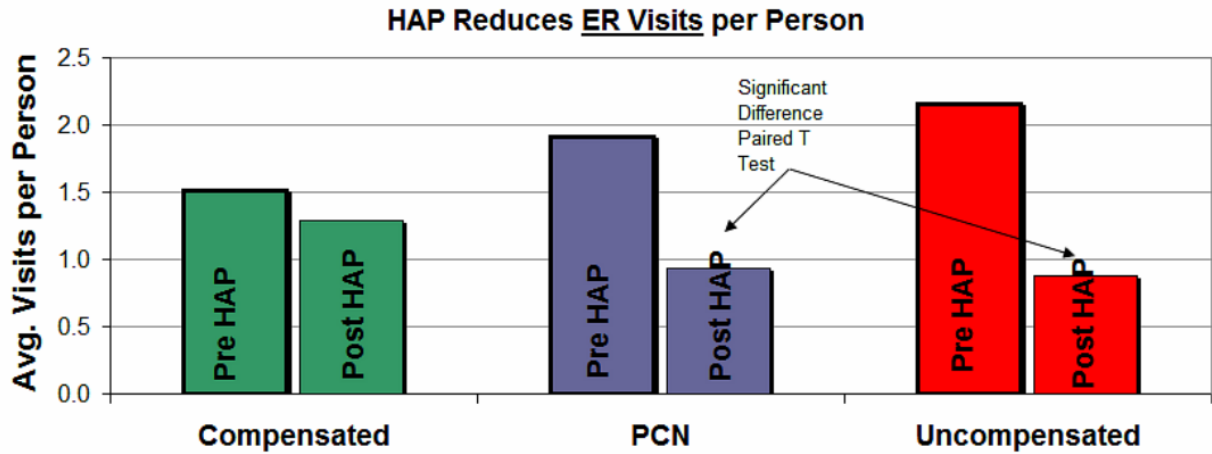
